

Code of Conduct

The ETH Cyber Group Alumni association expects all its members to uphold the highest standards of respect, responsibility, honesty, and integrity in their conduct between members and with the ETH Cyber Group Alumni association board.

As a foundational code, all ETH Cyber Group Alumni members adhere to [The Respect Code of Conduct](#) as applies to all ETH Zurich members.

In addition, all ETH Cyber Group Alumni members agree to the following guidelines:

Integrity and quality of discussion: All members agree to enter and participate in ETH Cyber Group Alumni events with an open mind. Members cultivate a collegial, constructive, and inclusive discussion culture. Members should promote progressive and creative thinking, and first and foremost create an inclusive atmosphere that shapes the community. The association wants to foster an inclusive environment that mirrors the diverse, interdisciplinary field of cybersecurity, wherein all expertise has equal standing. The goal is collaborative thinking through transparency, trust, and positive mutual regard.

Confidentiality: To encourage open discussion and to facilitate the sharing of information, all forums and events hosted by the ETH Cyber Group Alumni take place under the Chatham House Rule, unless specifically stated otherwise before the event by the board. The Chatham House Rule states: When a meeting, or part thereof, is held under the Chatham House Rule, participants are free to use the information received, but neither the identity nor the affiliation of the speaker(s), nor that of any other participant, may be revealed. All ETH Cyber Group Alumni events are closed to the public unless stated otherwise before the event by the board.

Any violation of the code of conduct may result in actions up to and including expulsion from the ETH Cyber Group Alumni association.
